**RULES**

1. Exhibitors must be enrolled in the Dairy Cattle Project or doing similar work in another youth organization to exhibit/show.
2. To exhibit an animal at the Brown County Fair, youth must have been in at least the third grade during the current year.
3. Livestock must be the property of the exhibitor unless on shares or managerial agreement.
4. In the calf classes, an animal must be under the daily care of the exhibitor for a minimum of 4 months prior to the fair.
5. Registration papers on purebreds must be presented to the department's superintendents at the time of the animal placement at the fair. Failure to do so will automatically eliminate the exhibitor. This is the exhibitor's responsibility.
6. Each animal over 6 months old must have a permanent identification number to exhibit at the fair. **See ANIMAL HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS for further information.**
7. Each animal must be cared for by the exhibitor at the exhibitor's own risk and cost and shall remain until the closing day of the fair.
8. Any exhibitor failing to properly care for any livestock exhibit will forfeit all premiums.
9. No more than 8 head to be exhibited by 1 exhibitor, and not more than 1 animal to be shown in each lot number by 1 exhibitor.
10. Garments with commercial advertising will not be allowed to be worn in the judging ring.
11. Members must exhibit their own project animal in showmanship.
12. A champion and reserve champion will be chosen from classes with sufficient entry numbers at the judge's discretion.
13. If 16 or more animals are entered, at the discretion of the judge, the class may be divided into 2 or more approximately equal groups according to weight, age or other identification.
14. All dairy males over 4 months of age must have a ring in their nose.
15. To show at State Fair, exhibitor must show the same animal at County Fair in the same year.
16. See Dept. 00J for Herdsmanship.
17. Animal Stall, Pen & Cage Reservations Form is found online at [www.browncountyfair.com](http://www.browncountyfair.com) or by calling 920-606-5120. It must be submitted by July 28th.
18. No one may approach the judge before or during the show. Technical questions should be directed to the ring steward, superintendent, or if they are not available, to the fair office. Exhibitors are encouraged to thank the judge for their work after the show is complete.

**AGE CLASSIFICATIONS**

(1) Dairy Cattle.

A spring calf is one born on or after March 1 of the exhibit year.

A winter calf is one whose date of birth is between December 1 of the year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 or 29 of the exhibit year.

A fall calf is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and November 30 of the year preceding the exhibit year.

A summer yearling is one whose date of birth is between June 1 and August 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.

A spring yearling is one whose date of birth is between March 1 and May 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.

A winter yearling is one whose date of birth is between December 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and February 28 or 29 of the year preceding the exhibit year.

A fall yearling is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and November 30 of the second year preceding the exhibit year.

A 2 year-old is one born between September 1 of the third year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the second year preceding the exhibit year. A 2-year-old includes a yearling that has freshened.

A 3 year-old is one whose date of birth is between September 1 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the third year preceding the exhibit year.

A 4 year-old is one whose date of birth is between September 1 of the fifth year preceding the exhibit year and August 31 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year.
